London's COVID-19 Assessment Centres are operated by the London Health Sciences Centre, St. Joseph's Health Care London, the Thames Valley Family Health Team, the Middlesex-London EMS, the Middlesex-London Health Unit and the City of London. Ontario's Assessment Centres are out-of-hospital clinics where people can be seen by a healthcare provider for COVID-19 related concerns, rather than have them visit an Emergency Department, Urgent Care Centre or their family doctor's office. There will be no medication or treatment onsite at the COVID-19 Assessment Centre.

Can people walk up to the assessment centres or is a vehicle required?

Pedestrians can walk up to London's COVID-19 Assessment Centres. At the first check point, you'll be asked some preliminary questions and then you'll be directed to a waiting area outside (please dress for the weather). When a health professional is ready to see you, you'll receive a text message to go inside the assessment centre.
