Regarding: Weekly Update 36

Current Collective Agreement language, provisions, and past practices are subject to a statutory freeze during the period of central and local collective bargaining bargaining (Labour Relations Act, 1995, Section 86, Subsection 1).

Violations of the collective agreement <u>must</u> be reported immediately to the ETFO Local office (519-474-3150).

Local Bargaining

A reminder that information regarding the local tentative agreement ratification process has been emailed to all Teachers.

Classroom Budget and Student Supplies

As Teachers are aware, the woefully inadequate classroom budget for student supplies in the 2024-2025 school year is \$200.00 per classroom. It has been pegged at \$200.00 per classroom since the 2000-2001 school year.

That amount might procure the following:

- 1 package of 20 notebooks
- 6 boxes of Duotangs- 25/box
- 1 Box of glue sticks- 30/box
- Student Calculator Kit- 10 Calculators
- 1 package of Fun Tak adhesive

No pencils. No erasers. No pens, or pencil crayons. No paper. Not much of anything. \$16B in public money for a battery plant but no money for pencils, erasers, and paper.

This starving of classrooms makes teaching, and learning, more difficult, and will inevitably lead to greater inequities in the public education system.

The matter was raised at Labour Management and ETFO will continue to lobby for increases in per classroom budgets.

Our London Family

June 6, 2024, marks the third anniversary of the tragedy that befell the Afzaal family. Not an accident, but a deliberate act of violence that was directed at a London family who were targeted simply because they were Muslim. Shame.
